PROFESSIONAL COOK TRAINING PROGRAM (ACE-IT)

Accelerated Credit Enrolment in Industry Training (ACE-IT) allows grade 11 and 12 students the opportunity to achieve graduation credits in their first year of technical training in careers that offer apprenticeship. The one-year Professional Cook Training Program offered at Burnaby Central provides students with a unique opportunity to earn graduation credits and industry certification.
